CHRISTIANS and the Credit Crunch

Parables about Poverty and Prosperity

Jesus had a great deal to say about poverty and wealth. Because Western Christians have been exceptionally blessed with material prosperity, His teaching on this subject has particular relevance.

And all the more so when the current credit crunch has shaken the financial fabric of the world and exposed weaknesses in the banking system which beggar belief. Its impact will not just affect our personal circumstances, but will devastate poorer countries and hinder Christian missions.

In this GLO Mini Bible School, we will explore Jesus' teaching about the accumulation and use of our wealth at a time when Christians must make a reassessment of their commitment to serving Him in this area of their lives.

Focusing on the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus in Luke 16, Alastair Noble will explore the historical accumulation of wealth in the West and the responsibility it brings to individuals.

From the parable of the Rich Fool in Luke 12, David Clarkson will consider the temptations of wealth and the responsibility of Christians to give a proportion of their wealth back to the service of God.

From the parables of the vineyard workers in Matthew 20, Stephen McQuoid will explore Christian attitudes to practical challenges such as wages, bonuses, investment and debt.

A special visitor called Eric Mango from Congo will be interviewed by John Speirs and will share his experience of poverty and trauma having been caught up in the war in the Congo. Hearing about Eric's rich spiritual experience is not to be missed.
